Week 39:
from Sept 23rd

Reward for Discipleship; Mark 10:17-31 - Revd Tim

What must I do to inherit eternal life? This is a question that is self explanatory to the readers of the New Testament and yet remains a stumbling block to those who choose not to. It does sound like a good question. We may naturally assume Jesus to say that if you want to inherit eternal life, repent of your sins, accept me, Jesus, as your Lord and Saviour and follow my teachings. But no. Jesus asks why the man calls him 'good'.

This man has not recognised Jesus as Messiah, the Saviour. Jesus is much more than good teacher, he is the Saviour.

How do you go with the following? 'You shall not murder, you shall not commit adultery, you shall not steal, you shall not give false testimony, you shall not defraud, honour your father and mother.' The young man said he scored well here. But it is not enough for Jesus. For these moral markers can be kept by anyone. There is nothing unique about not murdering or defrauding someone. These are simply good things to adhere to. If this is all it takes to inherit eternal life, then Jesus didn't have to die.

For it is his death that has allowed access to the realm where God dwells. Jesus didn't simply die for good intent.

Just as Jesus said to the man that he had to sell everything to follow him, giving everything to the poor, we too are to sacrifice or give up the things we hold dear to. They may not be material object. They may in fact be things that God finds detestable and desires us to leave behind as we follow Christ. And it is hard sometimes to leave the things we love. Just as hard as for a rich person to walk away from. -Revd. Tim
