from Nov 25th

There is always more. Here in chapter 4, we are reminded that things can get tense right around the finish line. Not that this spells the end of things for Ruth, but the end of the story. There is much to rejoice as the promise of lineage is displayed for Ruth. For right in the middle of this Earthly DNA pathway to Christ, we find a Moabite. We can gain great comfort in this. Firstly because she is grafted in by the Grace of God, just as we are. Second, it shows that God can ordain what He pleases.

But as we know, things don't always end well. What would the story of Ruth look like if she were to die during child birth, or what if she had married the first of the kinsmen redeemers instead of Boaz? How would the story have panned out then?

That's kind of how we view our own lives sometimes. We break a bone or two, some of us get very sick. Some of us lose all that we have and we turn to God and ask why. Does this mean that God took His eye off us for a split second and this was the outcome? Short answer: No. We tend to think that good is God and not so good is life. What if God intended things to happen the way they did? We know the fullness of God's Will for Ruth when we find her in the genealogy of Christ. What mark are we making on the world that gets God's attention? It will be when people in the future look back over our lives, that we will make sense in God's Will.
